

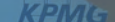

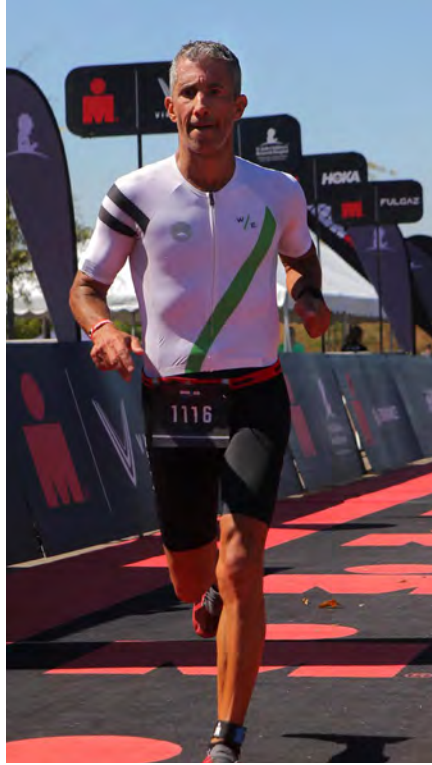
President & Chief Executive Officer

Starting in January with the Walmart UCI Cyclo-Cross World Championship and continuing throughout the year, the Ozark Outdoor Foundation (OZF), along with our amazing partners, supported a diversity of outdoor recreation events that showcased the best of our region. We formed the Ozark Outdoor Foundation one year ago with a simple vision: to create healthy outdoor recreation opportunities for every person in our community.

Because we did not want to be just another events company, our philanthropic purpose is central to every event we support. Our support has raised funds for area public libraries, youth recreation programs, public school programs, hospitals and trail maintenance organizations. We are particularly proud of how we bring multiple partners into a single event to celebrate a particular cause. A great example of this is our OZ Kids™ series in conjunction with the Bentonville Public Library. In this series, we highlight the vital role that public libraries play in a community. 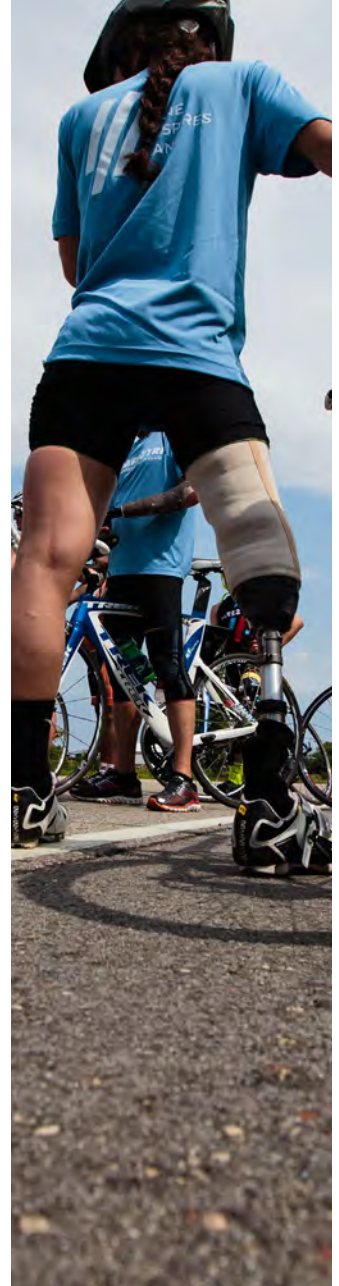

Summer Reign

Arkansas Enduro

"I just about hit rock bottom," admits enduro mountain bike racer and adventure athlete Summer Reign. Battling past drug addiction and substance abuse, Summer now uses intense outdoor recreation as a replacement lifestyle and to inspire others who are experiencing similar substance abuse and addiction challenges.

Summer's passion for mountain biking began with Speak Up About Drugs' Ride for Recovery program. Putting in the practice and preparation to build the skills necessary to complete a demanding course is her new focus. She is sober and, in her recovery, has found that biking not only fills her need for adrenaline but also gives her a healthy outlet for her stress and frustration, as well as a sense of community and support. She says, "Biking has changed my life profoundly ... there's no finish line for me."

Summer is always ready to test the limits, which is why she loves participating in the Arkansas Enduro Series - a form of mountain biking that combines cross-country endurance, technical downhill features and the ability to adapt to varying terrain. She is also part of Team Natural State that will compete in Expedition Ozark, a five-day expedition level adventure race scheduled for April 2023.

Summer is grateful OZF is helping stage local events that are accessible, enjoyable and welcoming regardless of ability or background. "When you are on a bike and going down difficult terrain fast, you can't think about other things, you have to be in that moment ... biking saved my life, I feel that in my heart," she added.

OZ Paratri Camp

A barrier to entry: easy to identify, harder to remove. Undaunted and with the support of our anchor partners Walmart and Deloitte, we created the OZ Paratri Camp to demonstrate our commitment to open outdoor recreation to all, regardless of ability. To give it our best, we teamed with Dare2Tri, the best adaptive sport organization in the US, to share their expertise in swimming, biking and running with 12 athletes from seven states.

From military veterans to committed athletes of varying circumstances, skill levels and ages, our three-day clinic provided one-on-one coaching in Bentonville. A recent stroke and heart attack survivor, Kathy Gonzalez registered for the OZ Paratri Camp at the encouragement of her friend before it dawned on her that she couldn't swim, ride a recumbent bike, or run. Although she had steadily progressed since her health issues, a triathlon seemed far beyond what she thought possible. Kathy shared, "The OZ Paratri Camp opened a whole new world to people like me who thought their illnesses or disabilities confine them to a certain box. The world is not square. We may not be able to do it the same way you can do it, but we can still get it done."

For Kathy, overcoming her own apprehensive thoughts and self-doubt about the OZ Paratri Camp were her biggest challenge. But the camp, held at the Bentonville Community Center, showed her that in the right place and with the right people, there is always a path forward. Kathy's weekend at the OZ Paratri Camp not only changed her life – she now works triathlon training into her daily routine – but has motivated her family, friends and church group to get moving outdoors and become healthier. For her, the community in Northwest Arkansas is inspiring by promoting a healthier lifestyle for everybody. Now as a parathlete, she learned that with support, appropriate adaptations, and a willingness to put in the hard work, anything and everything is possible.

OZ Kids™ Community Series

The OZ Kids™ Community Series offers families affordable, fun and safe outdoor recreational activities throughout the region. Made possible with generous support from Arvest and KPMG, the centerpiece of the community series is the OZ Kids™ Fat Tire Criterium, offering kids a fun race in a safe place.

The Crit Series exposes kids of all ages, skill levels and walks of life – and their families – to the healthy, welcoming and adventure-filled world that biking offers. The inclusive atmosphere of this series extends to all corners of our community such as the Gower-Jackson family—recently immigrated to the US from South Africa. Not only did this race series provide their family, including Michael (10) and Cameron (5), activity-packed days outdoors, it also created opportunities to establish new community connections and a sense of community spirit.

In addition to the race and festival atmosphere, one of our anchor sponsors, KPMG, donated thousands of books to attendees as part of their "Family for Literacy" initiative. To ensure no child is excluded due to financial hardship, our community partner Pedal It Forward provided hundreds of bikes and helmets to any family indicating need. To complete the virtuous circle of our philanthropic commitment, we donated proceeds of the series to the Bentonville Public Library Foundation.

Grit Series

Our Grit Series events offer unique and challenging outdoor experiences with something for everyone. Events within this series may be OZF owned and operated or produced by one of our local partners that we support. Events produced or supported this year include:



Arkansas Enduro Series: Five race series across Northwest Arkansas that attracts racers from throughout the Midwest.



OZ Mile Swim: In our inaugural year, this event, held at beautiful Beaver Lake, welcomed over 300 swimmers from 17 states including four professional swimmers. The highlight of the event was Oregon resident Kevin Leeders, 76, who swam with his daughter and granddaughter.



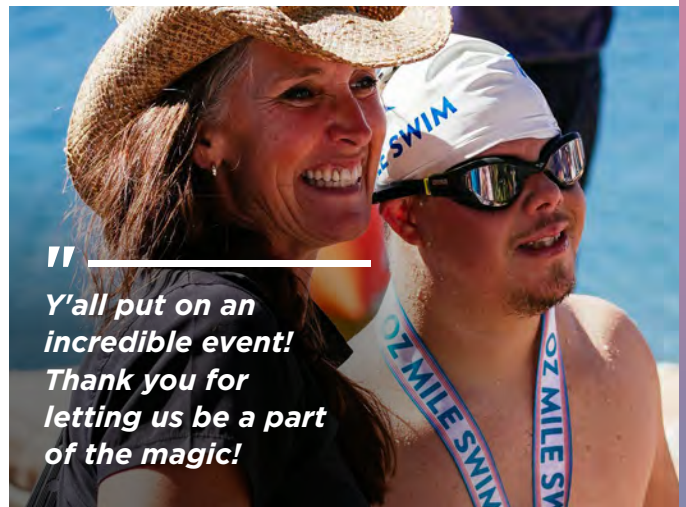

Summit Series

The Summit Series is focused on world championship and national race events, where elite and professional racers participate alongside competitive amateurs.

Over the last year, OZF has supported four major events.

In January 2022, the Walmart UCI Cyclo-Cross World Championship in Fayetteville hosted 219 world-class athletes from 21 different nations for four days of riveting cycling. Over 17,000 spectators came to experience the event, which was supported by over 500 volunteers.

The Moosejaw US Pro Cup involved four days of cross-country and short track cross-country cycling events in April 2022. Over 600 cyclists from 32 states and eight countries, including an unprecedented 30% female participation, raced in challenging conditions.

The Walmart Joe Martin Stage Race is the oldest existing cycling stage race in North America and the largest outdoor recreation event in Arkansas. Over 750 athletes and teams from 27 countries and all 50 states took part in 2022. With Walmart's support, the race was able to award equal prize purses for men and women for the first time at this year's event.

The Walmart OZCX and UCI Cyclo-Cross World Cup in October welcomed thousands of spectators to Fayetteville for a weekend of internationally-televised, world-class racing. The event had a particular charitable focus, raising awareness and fundraising for the Arkansas Children's Northwest Hospital, which serves more than 200,000 kids in the area.

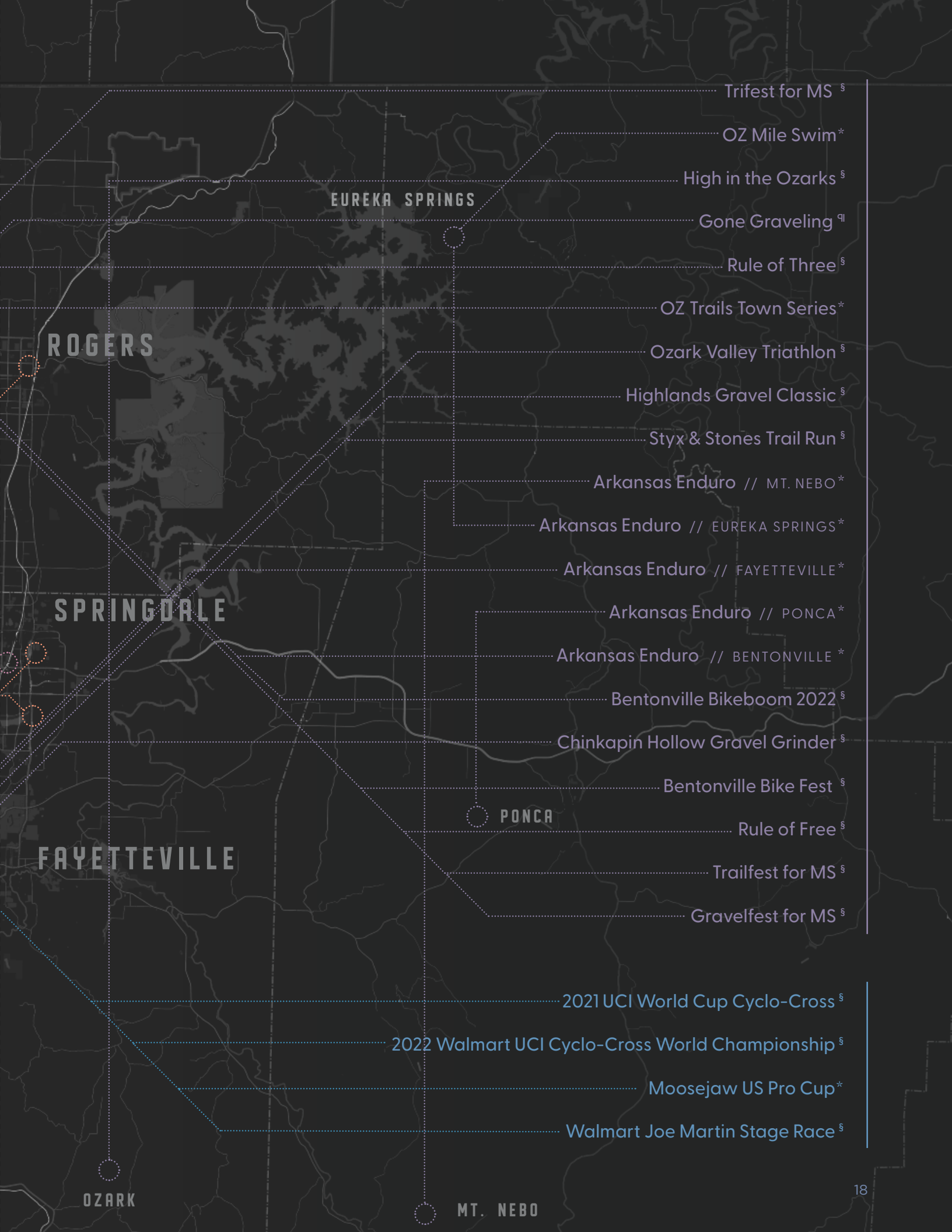
